

## **ANNEX I: EVALUATION TEAM BIOGRAPHIES**

### ***Ms. Malin Oud, Project Leader***

As Project Leader, Malin Oud is responsible for the overall assessment and has end responsibility for the assessment report.

Malin Oud is head of the Raoul Wallenberg Institute's Stockholm office and Team Leader, Economic Globalisation and Human Rights. She has more than 15 years' experience of policy dialogue, development cooperation and engagement with the business sector on human rights. In 2011-2016, Malin Oud was the founder and managing director of Tracktwo, a consultancy specialised in sustainable development, corporate responsibility and human rights; and worked strategically and operationally with human rights due diligence, social impact assessments, evaluations, stakeholder dialogue, policy briefs, programme development and training for companies, government authorities, academic institutions, and international organisations and NGOs. She was head of RWI's Beijing Office from 2001 to 2009, and has worked as a consultant, programme manager and adviser to the UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, the United Nations Development Programme, the Global Business Initiative on Human Rights, the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), and the Institute for Human Rights and Business. Malin Oud is a Member of the Board of Directors of Sweden-China Trade Council, where she also serves as Chairperson of Sweden-China Forum for Sustainable and Responsible Business. She studied Chinese language, Chinese law and international human rights law in Lund, Kunming, and London, and has an MA in International Development from Melbourne University. Malin has conducted a number of programme evaluations and impact assessments in China, including a Trade Sustainability Impact Assessment (SIA) of the investment agreement that the EU is currently negotiating with China; an evaluation of a number of projects supported by the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida); an evaluation of the Netherlands Human Rights Fund; and an evaluation of an Adessium Foundation grant to Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch.

### ***Dr. Liang Xiaohui, Senior Researcher***

Liang Xiaohui is Deputy Chief Economist, China National Textile Information Centre; Chief Researcher, Office for Social Responsibility, China National Textile and Apparel Council; and Adjunct Professor, Peking University Law School.

Dr. Liang used to be the program coordinator of the Human Rights Master Program at Peking University, China's first professional human rights education project. Mr. Liang later joined the Office for Social Responsibility of China National Textile and Apparel Council as Chief Researcher, in charge of the development and promotion of CSC9000T, China's first voluntary CSR initiative and social responsibility management system. Dr. Liang is the leading expert in the development of other Chinese industry-specific CSR initiatives by other business associations in China, including the China Federation of Industrial Economics (CFIE, 2009), the China International Contractors

Association (CHINCA, 2010), the China Tea Marketing Association (CTMA, 2011), China Electronics Standardization Association (CESA, 2012), China Small and Medium-sized Enterprise Council (CSMEC, 2013), China Chamber of Commerce of Metals Minerals & Chemicals Importers & Exporters (CCCMC, 2014), and China Association of Communications Enterprises (CACE, 2015-16) . Especially, he has helped establish the implementation mechanisms of these codes and guidance, including auditing and assessment systems and tools, capacity building schemes for managers and auditors etc. Meanwhile, he has participated in the development of various international instruments on social responsibility and responsible business initiated by the United Nations and the OECD. Since 2006, Dr. Liang has taught the course “Business and Human Rights” at Peking University Law School and he is the first Chinese scholar teaching this course in China. Dr. Liang is now also a guest professor of the Corporate Legal Center of Shanghai Jiaotong University and China University of Political Science and Law, a member of the Human Rights and Labour Rights Working Group of the United Nations Global Compact, and Chair of the Standard Committee of the Chinese Research Think Tank of Social Responsibility. In June 2016, Dr. Liang was recognized by the United Nations Global Compact as one of the world’s ten Pioneers in Sustainability Development Goals.
